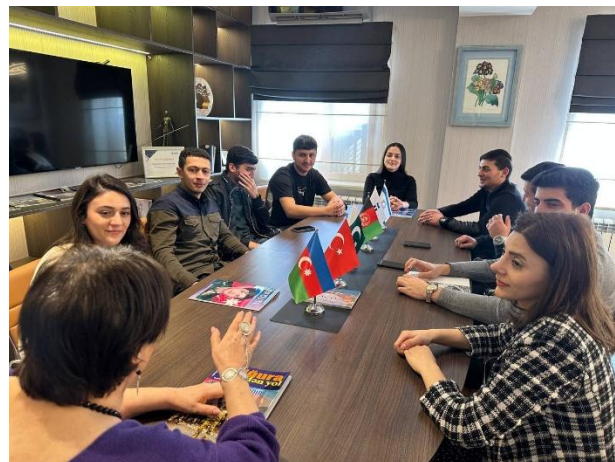
Legal Assistance and Advocacy:

4. Special Programs for Minority Groups

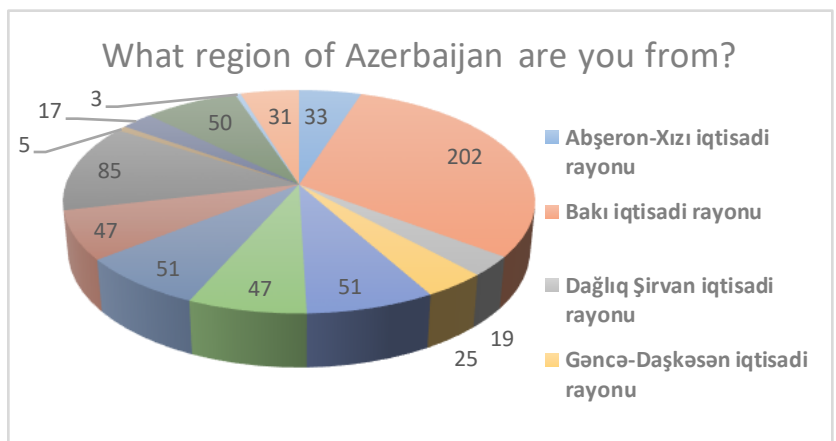
The Support Center tailors its services to the specific needs of different minority groups. Some of the special programs available include:
